## RED wrist bands

All children O-5 yrs MUST swim with parent/ guardian (15+yrs)



To ensure the health and safety of all pool users, we appreciate your cooperation in following the pool rules and Ministry of Health Regulations (565). Enjoy your swim!

- For the safety of our guests, those with a seizure disorder or other serious medical conditions should be accompanied by an individual knowledgeable of their condition and responsible for their direct supervision.
- A cleansing shower with warm water and soap must be taken before entering the pool, and after using the toilet facilities.
  No person infected with a communicable disease or having open sores on his or her body shall enter the pool.

Maximum of two children for each parent or guardian (2:1)

## YELLOW wrist bands

Children 6-9 years who DO NOT PASS swim test (2 widths)

MUST swim with parent/guardian (15+yrs)


Maximum of four children for each parent or guardian (4:1)

- No person shall bring a glass container onto the deck or into the pool.
- No person shall pollute the water in the pool in any manner and that spitting, spouting of water and blowing the nose in the pool or on the deck are prohibited.
- No person shall engage in boisterous play in or about the pool.
- The maximum number of bathers permitted on the deck and in the pool at any time is 280.
- The emergency telephone and AED unit are located at the life guard office. Please follow the instructions of the lifeguards.

## **GREEN wrist bands**

Children 6-9 years who PASS swim test (2 widths -18.5m each)

MAY swim unaccompanied Parent or guardian must be in the pool Thank you for your cooperation in keeping the pool safe, healthy and enjoyable for all users.



CHILDREN 7/8/9 YEARS OF AGE CAN TAKE A SWIM TEST PROVIDED THEY ARE 4'3" CHILDREN 10 OR OLDER MAY SWIM ALONE
